

# MPI Drug & Alcohol Testing Program

**DATIA, the Drug and Alcohol Test Industry Association recognize Mountain Peaks Inc. as an ACCREDITED COLLECTION FACILITY.** Collectors are trained and certified in all phases of urine, breath, hair, and saliva sample collection and processing. Collectors are re-certified annually to ensure consistency. The Department of Transportation, or DOT guidelines, 49CFR part 40, are observed to maintain the integrity of the chain-of-custody of the sample provided by the donor to the laboratory for calibrated testing and reporting.



**Lab Based Testing:** Urine samples are collected and processed following the **DOT 49 CFR part 40 guidelines.** Collections can be monitored or observed at the instruction of the referring agency. Chain of custody, adulteration monitoring, custody control and documentation maintained throughout the collection procedure to insure integrity of the sample collected. Results of toxicology testing are available electronically via MOUNTAIN PEAKS INC. secure web-based database TETON© Results are posted online immediately upon arrival and can be faxed to the referring agency.



Laboratory based testing provides screening for the following drugs:

THC (Marijuana), Amphetamines/Methamphetamines, Opiates, Cocaine, Benzodiazapines, Barbiturates, PCP, and Alcohol/Ethanol. Validity is confirmed through the inclusion of Creatinine as a marker in the screen of compounds in the sample tested.

**EtG Alcohol Testing: Via urine:** EtG, or Ethyl Glucuronide is a metabolite present in the human system after the consumption of alcohol and will remain in the system for up to eighty hours after the alcohol is consumed. EtG testing enables agencies to monitor alcohol abuses with a greater window of detection. Samples may be tested for the standard drugs of abuse and EtG simultaneously.

## Role of the collector:

- The specimen collector ensures that the collection procedure and integrity of the sample are not compromised.
- Interpretation of test results are reserved for Medical Review Officers, Physicians, Toxicologists, or the referring agency.
- It is not the role of a professional collector to interpret results, provide toxicological advice, or provide incentives.
